He found out at 69 years old that he was Aboriginal and that he had 3 brothers, 2 sisters and the biggest mob of nieces and nephews. We assisted him with meeting his brother and sister, and several other family members. We are currently planning to hold a big family reunion for him to meet the rest of the family. It has been an amazing journey, with more still to come. Our Bringing Them Home Worker can assist with Birth Certificates, tracing Family/Family Trees, connecting to Home and Stolen Generation Reparation Packages. Richard Bamblett our Case Co-Ordinator will be responsible for referral and assessment of the client's needs, using strength-based approach to garner the family needs in consultation with the Cultural Broker. Through ongoing consultation, the FCA team can help identify crisis issues with the families support and develop a robust case plan to help identify strategic goals for the family to aid in curbing the ongoing involvement in the Justice system and help break the cycle.

Jodie Lovett our Cultural Broker will be responsible for research and assessment on the cultural impact within the family. The Cultural Broker will work in conjunction with

FAMILY CENTRED APPROACH PROGRAM

The Family Centred Approach program aims to empower and further strengthen Aboriginal families with an individual member engaged in or at risk of engagement with the justice system.

The service will support the families of a range of groups, depending on the needs in the region.

This role will leverage the natural role and strength of Aboriginal families, with culture as a critical protective factor for all family members, to support better outcomes for individual family members.

There will be a range of supports available to families and/or through referrals to local services. The type of supports and intensity will vary depending on the needs of the family and the region where the service model is being delivered.

Examples of supports that may be provided include building understanding and knowledge of the justice system, system navigation, case planning and management, and cultural capacity building.



Types of service include group-based work, family mediation, Elder input and warm referrals.

Eligibility, intake and assessment will use a whole of family and strengths based approach. Once a family has been referred into the service, there will be an assessment process to identify and agree on family goals and support needs.

The safety of individual family members will be a priority throughout.

ABORIGINAL MATERNAL & CHILD HEALTH

Aboriginal Maternal & Child Health (AMCH) is a newly funded program in which our nurse Kristy will be working alongside the local councils to improve the health outcomes and participation of all Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander under 5-year-olds in the space of Maternal and Child Health. The AMCH nurse attends Winda-Mara once a month or the clinic can be visited anytime.

LAND MANAGEMENT

Recently, our female Budj Bim Rangers had a deadly learning experience with our Budj Bim Ranger Female Mentor Aunty Eileen taking the time to share the cultural knowledge of basket weaving with them.

Traditionally, poonyart grass is most commonly used to weave. The reeds would be woven into baskets for collecting as well as eel baskets to be placed in the gaps of stone and wooden fish traps to capture mature kooyang (eels).

The girls did a deadly job using the yarn instead of grass!
